

U.S. Probers Release New List of 575 'Enemies' of White House

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Congressional investigators made public Thursday a new list of 575 political "enemies" whom the White House sought—apparently without success—to subject to tax audits in 1972.

The joint Congressional Committee on Internal Revenue Service, after a six-month investigation, concluded that the Internal Revenue Service did not bow to pressure from the White House to conduct the audits. However, some of the persons on the list were audited, the report said.

The committee said it was still not certain whether the tax men had given favorable tax treatment to seven "friends" of the White House.

Among the "friends" identified in the past as having been singled out for special treatment were actor John Wayne and evangelist Billy Graham.

Laurence N. Woodworth, chief of staff of the congressional committee, said then White House counsel John W. Dean III gave the list to Johnnie M. Walters, former IRS director, on Sept. 11, 1972.

Woodworth said the 575 individuals appeared to be contributors to the campaign of George S. McGovern, the 1972 Democratic presidential candidate, or to liberal causes. One of them had paid more than \$1 million in taxes and many others were well-to-do.

Woodworth's staff inspected 1,417 tax returns for several years to see if those on the list had been singled out for audits. He said 26.3% of the returns had been audited—far more than would normally come under such IRS scrutiny.

But Woodworth said those on the list could have triggered a high percentage of audits by taking heavy deductions for entertaining or other business expenses.

"The heart of California's Democratic Establishment—virtually every truly heavy contributor to Democratic candidates in this state—is on the list supplied to the Internal Revenue Service.

There were many prominent persons on the list—including Assemblyman Willie Brown (D-

San Francisco), a candidate to be next Speaker of the State Assembly, Sen. William Proxmire (D-Wis.), Lt. Gen. James Gavin, actor Burt Lancaster and The Times' Pulitzer prize-winning cartoonist, Paul Conrad.
