

# Ben Sohn Injures Hand in Practice

## Unbeaten Indians Favored in Crucial Conference Struggle at Palo Alto

ankle and Krueger wore an adhesive tape stocking on his left leg. The rugged end from Antelope valley bruised a leg muscle several days ago in practice, but it has not hampered his pass catching.

Inaugurating his first year at the Palo Alto institution, Coach Clark Shaughnessy has converted the Indians from a spiritless unorganized tribe to a potent grid machine. Seven members of the starting eleven are returning lettermen and Coach Shaughnessy has had a powerful group of reserves from which to choose.

### BACKS THREATEN

In the Indian backfield are four of the most dangerous backs on the coast. Frank Albert, in the quarterback spot, is known as one of the best left-handed passers in the country, and Norm Standlee, at fullback, is being groomed for an all-American berth. According to football scouts, Standlee is rated with John Kimbrough as one of the hardest running backfield men in the United States.

Two veterans will hold down the halfback positions for the Indians. Pete Kmetovic, on the left side, is Stanford's blocking expert, while Hugh Gallarneau, at right half, is the pass catching ace of the squad.

The Indian forward wall will average 198 pounds, while the backfield will tip the scales at a 188-pound average. Standlee, weighing in at 225 pounds, will be the heaviest man on the squad. Only Sohn of SC, who will carry approximately 230 pounds outweighs Standlee.

### WARNECKE INJURED

If reports from Stanford are correct, Jack Warnecke, right tackle, will watch the game from the sidelines with an injured shoulder. Warnecke was hurt in practice earlier this week and his condition is doubtful. Shaughnessy will move a 210-pound sophomore, Ed Stamm, into the gap.

Before concluding its final practice session, the Trojan varsity enjoyed a few laughs at the expense of Fullback Me. Bleeker. The former Fremont star appeared at practice sporting a helmet which made him look like "the man from Mars."

It seems that Bleeker is nearsighted and to aid him in pass catching, the university purchased a helmet, specially constructed with built-in, unbreakable optical lenses. With the new device to aid his vision, Bleeker assures Headman Howard Jones that he will snag more passes in future games.
