Synanon and Bay City Talk 'Peace'

Center May Be Relocated in Friendly Pact

SANTA MONICA--Discussions are under way be tween the city and Synanon House, self-help center for narcotics addicts, which may lead to relocation of the center.

The talks were begun City Atty. Robert Cockins and Synanon's attorney, Fred Nicholas, in an effort to reach a friendly solution to differences between the city and Synanon which at times in the past have been bitterly fought.

Mutual Problem

"It's the first real, structive attempt to solve a mutual problem," Nicholas declared. "Cocklins and I declared. agreed that continuation of litigation would be time consuming and would accomplish little if anything.

"The intent of the discussions is to work out a compromise satisfactory to the city and Synanon," he observed. "I believe it is possible to do this."

Synanon, Nicholas said, desires to locate in an area where it will have no difficulty with zoning problems and will have adequate accommodations for 100 persons — including children.

Site Undermined

Officials of Synanon are exploring the possibility of renting or purchasing adequate facilities, he said. Whether the site will be in Santa Monica, city of Los Angeles or county territory angeles or county territoremains to be determined.
